Dear Barnard Families.

We have already finished our first trimester of the year! Report cards will be available to families on PowerSchool on December 11th. Directions for opening your child's report card can be found here. If you need assistance, please contact Becky Ford in the office. As you are aware, students are graded based on grade-level competencies. Teachers will be reporting on students' proficiency levels in both academics and habits of learning.

The New Hampshire Department of Education recently released comprehensive statewide assessment data for the 2022-2023 school year. The newly published data set provides information at the state, district and school levels. We are extremely pleased and proud of our school's academic accomplishments. The data reveals a consistent and encouraging trend of improvement across all subject areas at Barnard School. Particularly noteworthy is the absence of learning loss during the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. The longitudinal data covering grades 3 to 8 for ELA and Math, and fifth and eighth grades for Science, demonstrates substantial progress. In ELA, student proficiency has surged from 63% in 2019 to an impressive 78% in 2023. Similarly, Math proficiency has shown a notable increase from 68% to 76% during the same period. In Science, student proficiency has soared from 42% in 2019 to an impressive 64% in 2023. It's noteworthy that Barnard School's overall student proficiency surpasses the state average significantly across all subject areas, showcasing the school's dedication to academic excellence and growth.

Thank you for supporting our school's initiative to provide food for those in need. We collected a considerable amount of food for Our Neighbors Table last month. The organization was thankful for our contributions.

Our Student Council is teaming up with WHS student council and all local fire departments to collect toys for those in need. Barnard Student council is running a toy drive from December 4-11 to support this cause. Please consider sending your child to school with a toy to donate to the cause.

The 8th grade class will be holding a babysitting fundraiser on Friday, December 8th. 8th grade students and parents are offering to babysit school-aged children from 6pm-9pm. The cost for the service is \$20 per child or \$40 per family. They will be providing games, crafts, movies, and snacks. All proceeds will benefit the 8th grade end-of-year trip to New York City. Our girls and boys basketball teams and our cheering club are off to a great start! Come join us to cheer them on! Here is this season's schedule.



Additionally, it will be open during lunch/recess on **Thursday**, **December 7**th for anyone who was absent, forgot money, or wanted one last thing.



Nurse's News

Middle School students have been hard at work in their Health Classes this first trimester. Students in grades 6-8 attend a weekly health class to learn and practice the skills that they will use to maintain and improve their health throughout their lives.

The 6th grade was introduced to health class by learning about the different dimensions of health and how they interact to affect our overall well being. They spent some time thinking about their own habits in each dimension and identified areas of strength and areas to improve. They've also started learning about and practicing the



important skill of Accessing Information, which will help students to evaluate the information they are receiving and determine if it is valid and reliable.

The 7th grade has been practicing the difficult skill of

Analyzing Influences that affect their health, such as, family, peers, media and culture. Each student identified a behavior that would improve their personal health. They carefully analyzed a variety of factors that influenced their behavior and identified ways to manage negative influences.

In 8th grade, students have been practicing their communication skills to help them prepare for their transition to high school. They've rehearsed different ways to set boundaries and use refusal skills to avoid or reduce health risks.
