
We are looking forward to a happy and healthy October!

focus for 2023-24 . . . Growth Mindset.

All students K-8 will be learning about their developing, ever changing brains and how they can best take care of their bodies and brains in order to be their best selves in

all they do, in and out of the classroom. Weekly class lessons will focus on the skills of self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills and responsible decision making (CASEL competencies).

In addition, middle school students will have a class focused on the Habits of Learning and goal setting. Check out your middle school students' agenda book for their weekly goal and talk with them about how you can support their success. This month we will be focusing on learning the <u>WOOPS</u> method of goal setting . . . check it out. You might even want to join them in setting some WOOPS goals of your own.

Nurse's News

Maintaining a safe school environment for our students, staff and community requires a comprehensive and layered approach that considers the physical environment, the school culture and climate, as well as a process for early identification of concerning behaviors.

The Seacoast CARE Team is a behavior intervention team formed to provide support for students, staff, and the community. Through an established plan the team works to identify early signs of potentially disruptive behavior, self-harm tendencies, and the risk of violence towards others. This team is composed of members from all schools within SAU 21 and SAU 90. They take a proactive and collaborative approach to recognize, evaluate, and reduce the risks associated with students, faculty, or staff members who display concerning behaviors or thoughts. The Seacoast CARE Team is a valuable resource for our small school and community.

Another important tool to support safety in our community is the <u>Quick Tip Digital Hotline</u>. This is an **anonymous reporting system available for anyone to report unsafe or concerning behavior** including staff, parents, and students. This "See Something, Say Something" tip line allows anyone to communicate concerns about unsafe behavior within the SAU 21 community. Simply click "I need to report something." on the Barnard or any SAU21 district website to report unsafe behavior to school administrators: violence/assault, sexual harassment,

drugs/alcohol, threats, suicide threats or other concerns. Providing your contact information is optional, otherwise you will remain anonymous.

Spanish classes are off to a good start! Our enthusiastic K-1 students have been learning their colors through songs and stories. The students in grades 2-3 have started to work on expressing likes and dislikes of fruit through a fun song on Rockalingua. Grades 4-5 have also been using Rockalingua, to learn about hobbies. Each student has changed the words to a song so that it tells what hobbies they enjoy. Our students in grades 6 and 7 just completed summative assessments on greetings, introductions, and farewells. They are starting a writing activity this week. The 8th grade students have started to learn how to conjugate verbs, which is a challenging but important grammatical skill.
