Dear Barnard Families,

We are off to a great start for the 2023-2024 school year! We are so happy to have our returning students back at Barnard, and we are thrilled to welcome our new students this year.

The staff has been working hard over the summer to prepare for the new school year. We are looking forward to a year of learning and growing academically, socially, and emotionally. You can support your child at home by ensuring that they get a good night's sleep, and that they have a healthy breakfast before coming to school. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that children ages 6-12 receive 9-12 hours of sleep per night on a regular basis for optimal health.

Additionally, regular attendance is critical for student growth. Please make every effort to send your child to school each day if they are feeling healthy. Consistency in learning is of utmost importance. When students are out they miss critical learning experiences that put them behind their peers, and it is difficult for teachers to recreate the same experiences for students when they return. Additionally, continued absences effect the learning of all students in the class. Please make every effort to plan family vacations during scheduled school vacation times. Because daily activity in the classroom cannot always be predicted, assigning make-up work in advance of the trip is not possible.

All Barnard students will be receiving Chromebooks this week. K-3 students will be keeping their Chromebooks at school this year. All students in grades 4-8 will be bringing their Chromebooks home at night. Please be sure to have your child charge their computers nightly so they are ready for use the following morning. Additionally, please talk to your child about proper handling of the devices. Families will be charged for damages due to negligence.

If you have not already done so, please make sure to register your child on <u>PowerSchool</u> as soon as possible. We need this information to ensure the safety of your children. Additionally, It is important to set your child's default transportation setting in <u>Pick-Up Patrol</u> so we know where to send them each afternoon for dismissal.

Due to mandated staffing requirements on the playground, families must adhere to your assigned bus schedules. If your child is a second bus student, please do not drop them off prior to 8:15 am. Similarly, if your child is a first bus student, please do not leave them on the playground for pick-up at the end of afternoon recess (3:15pm). This is a safety issue, as we must maintain a proper staff-to-student ratio. Student drop-off time is at 8:15 am and pick-up time is at 2:35 pm.

We ask that you take the time to review the <u>Family Handbook</u> with your child. <u>Here</u> is a copy of the school calendar for the year. It is also available on our website.

We are thankful for your cooperation and support, and look forward to partnering with you to make the most of your child's learning experience.

As a reminder, any 5th-8th grade students who will be participating in afterschool sports will need to have a recent physical exam (within the past 12 months) on file before they are able to practice or attend any games/meets.
