It's definitely feeling like spring as we move through the month of April. That said, it is more important than ever to stay vigilant with regard to our safety protocols to maintain a healthy environment in our schools and community. Please remember to uphold protocols such as mask-wearing and social distancing as you enjoy the spring weather per NH Department of Health and Human Services.

NH Vaccine Anyone Age 16+

New Hampshire residents age 16+ are now eligible for the vaccine. On April 19th, anyone in New Hampshire (regardless of residency) age 16 and older are eligible register to receive their COVID-19 vaccine via the website: <u>https://www.vaccines.nh.gov/</u> or by calling 2-1-1. Data on the <u>NH DHHS COVID-19 Vaccination Dashboard website</u> provides vaccination trends for your reference. Vaccine recipients who are age 16 or 17 years old may only receive the Pfizer vaccine, which is available at all state-managed fixed sites and Walgreens locations.

Seacoast and Strafford County Public Health Networks are both engaging in planning for an option that will be available to ALL students who qualify for a vaccine. This will likely be one location that operates over a one to two day period in the upcoming weeks in our region. We will provide more details as soon as possible.

Spotlight on Competency Based Education

As part of our continual efforts to showcase the Competency Based Education (CBE) work at SAU 21, we acknowledged a presentation from South Hampton Middle School at the April board meeting. Specifically, we were able to provide insight into teachers' planning processes related to the following:

- <u>Unit Design</u>- the process by which teachers designate and articulate the 'big ideas' or 'essential questions' in a given learning experience.
- <u>Defining Competencies and Supporting Standards</u>- the process of building upon discrete information and translating it into transferrable skills and ideas that can be applied outside the classroom.
- <u>Instructional Design</u>- looking at the specific activities that take place in a given unit. These activities are intentionally planned in order to offer voice and choice in student learning, while offering instructive feedback to students and families throughout.
- <u>Assessment Practice</u>- determining how student performance can be measured with quality and consistency. In other words, how can we allow students to demonstrate their learning through an authentic and measurable product or experience? How can we provide opportunities for students to have ownership in this measurement?
- <u>Integrating Habits of Learning</u>- articulating the non-academic aspects of learning, including communication, collaboration, self-direction, and innovation. These are traits essential to student success, and transcend subject area.

As always, the most exciting part of the presentation included work samples from a variety of students, featuring both argumentative writing and verbal presentation skills. Kudos to the staff of South Hampton for applying and sharing these practices with the larger community. We plan to continue this work and communication throughout all of our districts this spring/ summer.
