Superintendent Sullivan informed the board he will contact Dr. Hayes and invite him to serve as interim principal at least through the end of the current school year.

The principal selection process was discussed. The organization and process of the two meetings scheduled to solicit feedback from North Hampton School staff and from parents and community members was discussed and a plan was developed.

Planning for the Board Goal Planning Session on May 15, 2017 was discussed. The board will consider Internal and External factors followed by a SWOT analysis (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats). The board will also review the 2016-2017 goals; develop goals for 2017-2018. The Board will also discuss on May 15, 2017 curriculum presentations for the 2017-2018 school year.

Board members will work on the following factors: political, economic, demographic, educational and North Hampton specific factors.
