
#### **Language Arts**



**Up Next:** At the start of trimester 3, students will begin an argumentative writing unit.




**Math** Mr. Walker

## Science

We started a new unit this week on contact forces. We will study different collisions and figure out why items are sometimes damaged during collisions.

We began by telling stories about collisions and damage--dropping phones seems to be a common event! By the end of the unit, students will be able to describe why this causes damage to the phone screen.



Students then made initial models to share their ideas about the unobservable interactions happening when two objects collide. Finally, we made our Driving Question Board. Question days are my favorite- students are so curious and are having unprompted scientific conversations that are wonderful to overhear!
