Highlights: From now until December 5th students are working on a summative titled, "European TImeline". This is a project based partner assessment. Students have a choice between a paper submission or a digital timeline submission. This project will assess both the habits of learning competencies and academic competencies. This week, students:


- Started the week with a small group problem solving challenge.
