Highlights: Students have begun brainstorming and working on their This I Believe essay. This essay allows students to share a life belief, and through the narrative process, explain how that belief was put into action.

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

Highlights: This week in social studies we explored longitude and latitude in a number of ways including a grid on the classroom floor where students could practice determining coordinates through a gross motor activity. The students also completed a mapping to differentiate between longitude and latitude. As a formative review, they students engaged with Plicker QR codes. The students completed self assessments and started their 5 Themes Summative Assessment.

State of the state

This week we:

- Made 3D models to observe the effects of different plates interactions.
- Turned the observations from our 3D models into diagrams. They look similar to diagrams professional scientists make!
- Read an article and watched videos of volcanic eruptions to understand how they form and what happens to Earth's surface when they erupt.
- Students were challenged to transfer their knowledge of earthquakes & plates to explain how Mt. Everest grows. Application of knowledge can feel very challenging!
